  - Primary Constituent is Law Enforcement



# Community Policing Defined



*Community policing is a philosophy that promotes organizational strategies, which support the systematic use of partnerships and problem-solving techniques, to proactively address the immediate conditions that give rise to public safety issues such as crime, social disorder, and fear of crime.*

## COPS Office investments since 1994:

- \$11.2 billion in awards to advance community policing through over 42,000 grants and cooperative agreements
- To over 13,600 State, Local, and Tribal law enforcement agencies

## Funding Overview (cont'd)

- To date, COPS has disseminated nearly 2,000,000 knowledge products
- Trained more than 500,000 policing professional and community leaders in topics such as violent crime reduction strategies, ethics and integrity, terrorism prevention and preparedness, school safety, partnership building, problem-solving, and crime analysis.
- \$377 million to address issues of production, proliferation, prevention, and distribution of methamphetamine.

## FY2010 Funding Overview

■ COPS Hiring Program	\$ 298,000,000
■ Technology Program (Tech)	\$ 170,223,000
■ Methamphetamine Initiative (Meth)	\$ 40,385,000
■ Tribal Resources Grant Program (TRGP)	\$ 40,000,000
■ Child Sexual Predator Program (CSPP)	\$ 24,000,000
■ Secure Our Schools (SOS)	\$ 16,000,000
■ Community Policing Development	\$ 12,000,000



# COPS Grant Programs



## Current Status of CHP

- Over 6,200 applications totaling over \$7 billion still pending from FY 2010.
- Agencies will be asked to update their applications in June to be eligible for FY 2010.
- \$ 298 million is available to make awards this year.



# COPS Grant Programs



## Secure Our Schools (SOS) Program

- Open solicitation for all local, state, and tribal law enforcement agencies that have primary law enforcement authority within a partner primary or secondary school
- Funding to establish and enhance school safety equipment, training and programs



# COPS Grant Programs



## Secure Our Schools (SOS) Program

### Requirements

A local cash match of 50% towards the total cost of the approved grant project is required

- May be used for
  - The placement and use of metal detectors, locks, lighting, and other deterrent measures
  - Security assessments
  - Security training of personnel and students
  - Coordination with local law enforcement
  - Any other measure that may provide a significant improvement in security



# COPS Grant Programs



## Child Sexual Predator Program (CSPP)

- Applicants nominated by a U.S. Attorney's Office or U.S. Marshal's Office, with particular need for resources to locate, arrest, and prosecute child sexual predators.
- Purpose of funding is to establish or enhance strategies to locate, arrest, and prosecute child sexual predators and to enforce state sex offender registration laws
